Reading Questions: The Golden Age of Athens

Read *Patterns of Interaction*, pp. 120-125, and respond to the following in separate, well-developed paragraphs

- 1. Who was Pericles? What actions did he take to strengthen Athenian democracy?
- 2. What are the most significant differences between Athenian democracy and U.S. democracy? What are the major similarities?
- 3. What is the Parthenon? How does its construction and appearance reflect Greek architectural styles?
- 4. What values are reflected in classical Greek sculpture? Select one of the following pieces of sculpture and explain how it reflects the artistic values of Ancient Greece: The Head of Pericles (p. 121); The Statue of Athena (p. 122); The Discobolos (Discus Thrower; p. 126).
- 5. What were the main themes of Greek tragedy and comedy? How did Greek comedy reflect Athenian political values and contribute to societal reform?
- 6. Who fought in the Peloponnesian War? What factors led to Sparta's ultimate victory?
- 7. Who were the 3 most well-known Greek philosophers? Name two ideas or concepts for which *each* was best known.
- 8. What do you think Socrates meant when he said, "The unexamined life is not worth living"? Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?
